

# Identifying properties where livestock are kept

Under Victorian law, individuals **must** have a Property Identification Code (PIC) for the properties on which they graze or keep the following livestock:

- cattle, sheep, goats, pigs, alpaca, llamas, deer, horses
- more than 100 poultry (i.e. domesticated fowl, chickens, ducks, geese, turkey, guinea fowl, pigeons, quail or pheasants) or 10 emus or ostriches.

## How can I apply for a PIC?

There is no cost when applying for a PIC, or to update PIC details.

To apply for a PIC:

- you can apply online or download an application form by visiting [www.agriculture.vic.gov.au/pic](http://www.agriculture.vic.gov.au/pic)
- contact the **Agriculture Victoria NLIS Helpline** on **1800 678 779** between 9.00am and 4.30pm Monday to Friday.

If you choose to complete a paper PIC application form you will need the Council Rate Assessment Number/s recorded on your annual rate notice/s for your property.

Regardless of your application method, a PIC card which displays your PIC number will be mailed to you.
