## Cat containment

Most cat owners (88\%) kept their cats contained to their property:

- for their cat's own safety ( $81 \%$ )
to avoid cat straying or getting lost (63\%)
- to avoid damage/nuisance to native wildlife (58\%)

## Participants

The Pet Census was conducted online from 3 July to 30 July 2023. It comprised:

- a panel survey which was representative of the Victorian general community
- an open survey available to any Victorian aged 18+ The panel survey received 5,069 responses, and the open link survey received 32,391 responses.

The main reason dog owners chose to go
The main reason dog owners chose to go
to a breeder was because they wanted a specific breed (62\%).

Cat owners were more likely to get their cats from a rehoming organisation (28\%) or animal shelter ( $22 \%$ ).

The main reason cat owners chose cats from a rehoming organisation or shelter was to help save the animal.

Around half (53\%) of pet owners obtained their most recent pet in the past three years.
The distribution of results suggests that pet acquisition increased over the COVID-19 pandemic, with elevated numbers from 2020 to 2022

The most common reason cited by pet owners for getting a pet was to provide companionship
(64\%).


## Source

Breeders were the most common source of acquisition among dog owners (51\%), but less common for other pet types
Fewer dogs were obtained from a rehoming organisation (17\%) or from an animal shelter (6\%).

42 percent had just one type of pet, 12 percent had two types and 4 percent had three or more types


Rates of pet ownership were highest among people who:

- are under 55 years old
- live in a house
- are in non-metropolitan Victoria
- have children under 18 years old
- have a household income of over \$120,000 per annum
- speak English at home

This project was conducted in accordance with the international quality standard ISO 20252, the international information security standard ISO 27001, as well as the Australian Privacy Principles contained in the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth). ORIMA Research also adheres to the Privacy (Market and Social Research) Code 2021 administered by the Australian Data and Insights Association (ADIA).

Around one in six respondents (16\%) had surrendered or rehomed a pet at some time in their lives. Among those, majority (61\%) said they had surrendered a dog, while more than one third (36\%) had surrendered a cat. The most common reason for surrendering pets was due to aggressive or reactive behaviours (23\%).

- Majority of dog owners ( $68 \%$ ) walked their dog at least once a day.
- Most dog owners allowed their dog off leash (71\%).
- Popular off leash areas were: designated off leash areas (55\%), parks (36\%) and beaches (31\%).

*The total average cost for horses was particularly high at $\$ 3,085$ per year while other medium or large mammals cost an average of $\$ 648$ annually.
