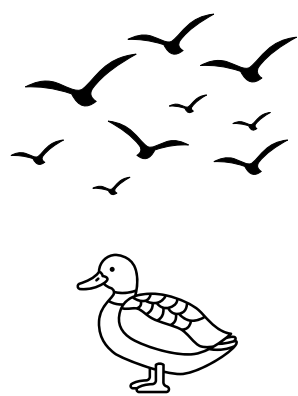


Keep your birds safe

Poultry farmers, backyard chicken and bird owners, are encouraged to follow these steps to protect your birds from H5 avian influenza.



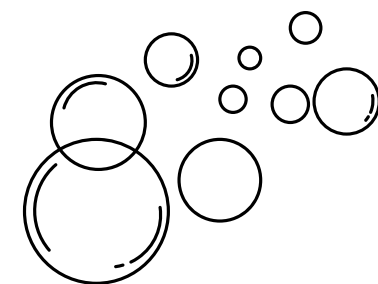
Limit contact

Prevent contact between your birds and wild birds. Keep bird feed and water out of reach of wild birds.



Limit visitors

Use signage, restrict access to essential personnel, provide protective gear, use footbaths, educate employees, and keep a visitor logbook.



Keep hands clean

Always remember to wash your hands and use sanitiser before and after entering a poultry area.



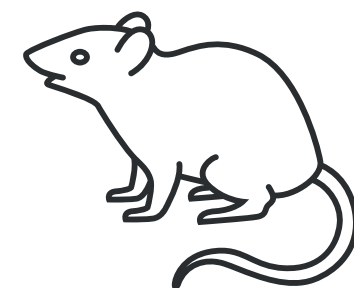
Biosecurity plan

Have a biosecurity plan and ensure that visitors and contractors follow the plan.



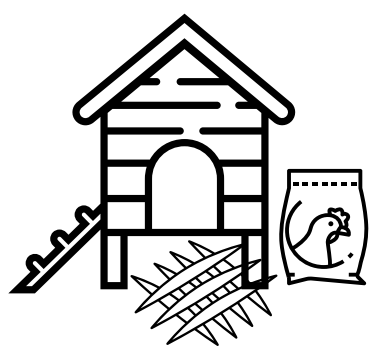
Restrict pets

Do not allow pets such as dogs, cats and other animals inside poultry housing.



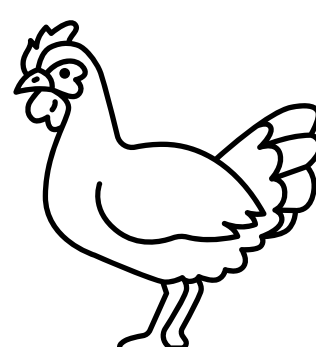
Control pests

Use effective rodent and insect control programs.



Clean frequently

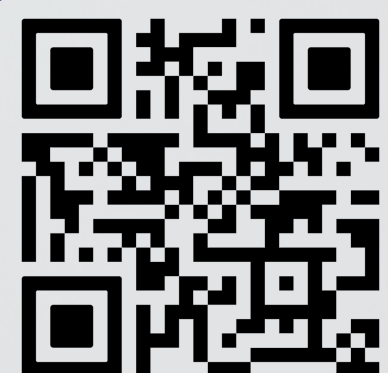
Regularly clean your chicken coop including feeders, drinkers and equipment.
